If a member of your group needs to leave the group for some reason, please take the whole group with you until you find a staff member to take charge of the student. **DO NOT LEAVE STUDENTS UNATTENDED!** As in all natural environments, there are hazards and we don't want to have any unfortunate incidents.
6. Feel free to ask questions of the Bog staff. Your educator also has material available that you can preview before your visit to the bog. We want you to have a great experience too!
